where, when and cost to file

Where to file

The County Auditor is the filing officer for all nonpartisan offices up for election in 2019.

The Secretary of State is the filing officer for Legislative District 13.

When to file

Candidate filing week is May 13-17

file by mail: begins April 29 | ends May 17

- your filing fee must accompany your declaration
- filings received prior to April 29 will not be accepted
- filings received after May 17, regardless of postmark, will not be accepted

- your filing is held until the filing fee is received if one is required
- filings received prior to May 13 will not be accepted
- filings received after 4pm on May 17 will not be accepted

Cost to file

Filing fees are **not** refundable under any circumstance. The Auditor's office accepts checks, cash, credit, or money orders. If you lack the income to pay the filing fee, you may submit a filing fee petition.

Exact filing fees are available on the list of offices up for election at www.yakimacounty.us/vote.

the declaration of candidacy

All candidates must submit a Declaration of Candidacy.

1. Candidate Information

Enter your information as you are registered to vote.

You are responsible for meeting all the qualifications of the position.

2. Campaign Information

If you do not provide campaign contact information, your voter registration information will be published on the list of candidates who have filed. Government offices may *not* be used for campaign contact information.

3. Ballot information

Print the jurisdiction, office name and position number that defines the office for which you want to be a candidate.

The responsibility for filing for the correct office is yours.

Print your name exactly as you want it to appear on the ballot. A title, rank, or symbol is not allowed.

party preference information: Do not list a party preference if you are a candidate for a nonpartisan office.

If you file for a partisan office, you may state the party name you prefer using 18 characters or less.

If left blank, "States No Party Preference" will be printed on the ballot.

Party preference does not imply that you have been nominated, endorsed, or approved by the party. It is entirely your decision and plays no role in determining how candidates are elected.

4. Filing fee

Mark the appropriate circle. Filing fees are not refundable and must accompany the declaration of candidacy.

5. Oath

Read and sign the oath. Your Declaration will not be approved without your signature.

Your Declaration of Candidacy is a public record.

April 29	candidate filing by mail begins
May 13	candidate filing begins; 9am
May 17	candidate filing ends; 4pm
May 17	lot drawing for ballot placement; 4:30pm
May 20	last day to withdraw; 4pm
May 24	candidate statement due for online local voters' guide; 4pm
July 19	ballots mailed for Primary
August 6	Primary
October 18	ballots mailed for General Election
November 5	General Election

Withdrawal of candidacy

If you decide you do not want your name printed on the ballot, you must submit a signed withdrawal form to the Yakima County Auditor's Office by 4pm on Monday, May 20.

Filing fees are not refundable, even if you filed for the wrong office.

No withdrawal is permitted if you filed during a special filing period.

Campaign finance reporting

Candidates should refer to the Public Disclosure Commission for reporting requirements and forms. To get you started, if you are a candidate in a district with over 5,000 registered voters, you are required to complete a C-1 and F-1 within 2 weeks of becoming a candidate.
